- Willingness to be ridden in the company of other horses
- Happiness; eagerness; willingness; keenness
- Partnership with rider
- Self-confidence
- Co-operation at exams (be patient with green horses)
- Safety of animal around horses and riders.

Conditioning:

- Soundness
- Good Physical condition
- Shoeing condition
- Tack area or legs (rubs or interference)

Trail Safety, Courtesy and Obstacles:

- Willingness to cross bridges, streams, etc.
- Remains calm around motorized vehicles
- Reaction to unforeseen obstacles on the trail
- General manners around people
