Requests for sanction dates require that one date per ride be presented to the sanction person for consideration. It is advisable that an "alternate" or "2nd choice" date be provided at the same time you send in this application, so that in the event of schedule conflict with another ride in your area, the sanction person is able to immediately provide you with your alternate date (providing that date is available). To avoid confusion, the alternate date IS NOT for the use of the ride in case of weather problems, rather the alternate date is for ACTRA use only. A ride is sanctioned with only one date and CANNOT BE CHANGED BY RIDE MANAGEMENT.

Minutes from Fall Annual General Meeting November 6, 2010 Amsterdam Inn, Moncton, NB

Meeting called to order at 11:15 by Irmgard Lipp.

Spring AGM minutes read by Donna Munn, sitting in for Donna Lee. Minutes approved as read by Jean Bridges, seconded by Gwenn Dexter. Minutes accepted.

Reports

- Treasurer report read by Pat Rideout. Accepted by Gwenn Dexter, seconded by Lynn Beazley.
- CaLDRA report read by Donna Munn. Accepted by Gwenn Dexter, seconded by Deanna Johnston.
- Endurance Canada report read by Donna Munn. Delle Fairclough is the Breeds and Industry Rep for Endurance Canada who are looking for people to be coaches. Accepted by Gwenn Dexter, seconded by Jennifer McDonald.
- Public Relations report read by Lynn Beazley. She mentioned the regular notices in Horse & Pony of the ACTRA rides and that we have a Facebook page as well. Also that the \$14 subscription rate for club members is due. Accepted by Gwenn Dexter, seconded by Deanna Johnston.
- Sanctioning report read by Donna Munn. 7 JP's, 3 IDR's, 5 CTR's, 2 LD's which made 17 possible rides to enter with a total of 380 miles. McDonald's Run already sanctioned for the 2011 ride season. Accepted by Gwenn Dexter, seconded by Jennifer McDonald.

Old Business

- Cooler for Bob Gielen riding at the WEG was not done due to shipping problems, etc.
- > Ride review sheet is on hold and not done yet.
- Discussion of the AERC and LD rules in or not in the rulebook.
- ACTRA event Volunteer Recognition Program. Lynn Beazley will send Karen Murray the participation sheet so any volunteers that want to participate can print off a copy to use.

New Business

The BOD reported that a little housekeeping work was done on the rulebook to correct a few omissions.

Discussion on the ride time for CTR's and IDR's. Ride time is 6 mph plus the hold.

- If a rider is over the time then it is mileage only, but the horse has to be vetted in.
- Error on CTR and IDR scoresheets re: the final pulse should read 30 seconds X 2

Changes will be made to the scoresheet.

It was mentioned by Pat Rideout that the picture on the front of our rulebook is not our club logo. It will be changed.

Discussion held. All new members will get a new rule book and the updated one will be on the club website for existing members.

Motion from Gwenn that the updated rulebook will be on the website for existing members and new members will receive theirs with their membership. The new rulebook will also be included in all Sanction Kits for the 2011 season. Seconded by Lynn Beazley. Motion carried.

Troy Beazley moved that we change the wording in the JP rulebook in the section of "any device for protection" remove; boots which extend above the coronet band. Seconded by Gwenn Dexter.

Kaaren LeBert made a motion that we add; Hoof boots are accepted. Seconded by Gwenn Dexter. Motion carried.

Discussion as to why our HEP insurance waiver has the section that says "I declare to wear a helmet". Donna Munn will contact HEP to see if this has to be on the form.

Lucy Rudge came forth with the idea of a CTR Team Challenge. All riders that would be interested should let Lucy know by the Spring AGM. All names will go in a hat and teams will be the luck of the draw. Teams will be 3 riders.

Lynn Beazley would like all club members to be part of Think Tank on how to get some new members. Jean Bridges and Donna Munn discussed the Jan Thaw in Fredericton the end of January. Moved by Lynn Beazley and seconded by Deanna Johnston that they have \$75 for expenses.

Motion to pay the Endurance Canada Equine Canada membership for the 2011 season.

Pat Rideout reported that only one \$200 ride rebate for the IDR/CTR or LD/END was paid out for this ride season.

Kaaren Lebert made a motion that we continue this for the 2011 ride season. Seconded by Kim DellaCioppa. Motion carried.

Pat Rideout mentioned that we need a new mount registration form. Donna Munn volunteered to get it done.

A vote was then held to fill vacant positions on the Board of Directors.

After the ride, Pam went up to the "moguls" with a manure fork to see if she could find the rider's lost hoofboot. There were many long puddles in this section. It occurred to her that people wearing hoofboots on their horses should carry unique flagging tape to put on trees in the area when they discover they have lost a boot. ACTRA Constitution

PURPOSE

The Atlantic Canada Trail Riding Association is a non-profit organization founded to promote and co-ordinate the sport of Competitive Distance Riding throughout the four Atlantic Provinces. ACTRA will accomplish these goals through the use of ride sanctioning and through supporting and/or sponsoring events such as clinics and seminars.

RULES

Except where otherwise outlined by a rule of ACTRA, ACTRA will be governed by the rules as outlined in the publication Robert's Rules of Order.

QUORUM

A quorum will consist of either of; 1. A majority of the current Board of Directors. Or 2. A majority of the membership of the club. All motions of the club must be passed by a majority vote of members present and must include a quorum.

A quorum for a committee of ACTRA shall consist of a majority of the committee and motions of the committee must be passed by a majority of committee members present.

MEMBERSHIP

ACTRA will accept memberships on a calendar year basis. Each membership enables the member to vote in only one annual meeting. A family membership will entitle the family to a maximum of two voting members.

DIRECTORS

ACTRA will elect directors to a maximum three year term. Whenever possible the terms of the board will be such that one third of the board comes up for re-election each year. Should a director leave office before the normal completion of their term, a replacement director will be elected to complete the original term.

OFFICERS

The Board of Directors will appoint the following officers; Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, Rules, Newsletter, Statistician, Publicity, Sanction. These positions are normally appointed from the directors, but may be appointed from the general membership.

AMENDMENT

This constitution can only be amended by a majority vote of the membership of ACTRA.

ABSOLUTION

Should ACTRA cease to exist or function in its entirety, any remaining funds of the club will be forwarded to another non-profit organization or charity.

Winter Reading - Book Review

Dark Horse by Tami Hoag

I picked this book up of course for the title and was soon in the "can't put it down" mode of reading.

The author is a competitive equestrian who has competed in barrel racing to jumping and says she has been a rider longer than a writer. She settled on dressage as her out-of-office passion and started competing in dressage in 1999.

This story is based on the huge circuit of riders who congregate each winter in Florida to compete in Dressage, Hunter/Jumper and other disciplines. Throw in some murders, romance and mystery and you've got a book that you won't put down!!

Here is an excerpt from the book

"Some of the finest people I've known have been involved in the horse business. Caring people who would sacrifice themselves and their own comfort for the animals who rely on them. People who kept their word. People with integrity. And some of the most loathsome, hateful, twisted individuals I've ever known have been involved in the horse business.

People who would lie, cheat, steal and sell their own mother for a nickel if they thought it would get them ahead. People who would smile to your face, pat you on the back with one hand and stab you in the back with the other."

Trust Your Crazy Ideas

Some ideas sound logical right from the start. The wheel and fire were obviously great concepts from the get-go.

But I wonder who first watched a chicken lay an egg and said, "Hey, let's eat that!" Yuck! That was probably met with some scepticism. At the time, no one had visions of fluffy chiffons, lofty meringues, yummy omelets or delicate soufflés.

New ideas always encounter criticism and opposition. But remember, all great ideas started in somebody's basement with one man or woman with a vision. The key is to believe in yourself and persevere.

So trust your crazy ideas. They could change the world!!

Getting through veterinary checks

A VET CHECK IS a very important part of an endurance ride. Getting through vet checks smoothly and quickly depends a lot on the rider. Most experienced ride veterinarians only take about two to three minutes to examine and assess the horse. A rider can aid and assist this procedure or make it unnecessarily slow and agonizing.

Two rules to keep in mind

Two rules to follow:

- 1. Be courteous and respectful to fellow riders.
- 2.Be attentive to your horse.

Untacking the horse can help cooling and be relaxing, while keeping the horse moving can prevent cramping and stiffening. At some events this is easy; you may be able to proceed directly to the vet without waiting. At other events or rides with a large number of competitors there may be a waiting line.

If there is a line, be courteous and stay focused, keeping your horse calm and moving when possible. This is not the time to be feeding your horse or visiting with your neighbor. Feeding the horse in some cases can increase or maintain an elevated heart rate.

Visiting and not staying focused may cause an unnecessary delay when a vet becomes available for the next horse and cannot get your attention because you are visiting or messing around with hay or feed buckets. When this happens it not only delays you getting through the vet check, but also other riders.

Once you are standing in front of the vet, being attentive and performing good horsemanship skills (having control of your

horse) will speed up and help the assessment of your horse. Again this is not the place for the horse to be munching on a carrot, eating hay, or trying to graze grass. The horse needs to be standing still, quiet and not eating, not rubbing its itchy head on you, or having its tack or blankets readjusted.

The vets are not there to pull you, but to help you get through the ride.

Get the horse's attention by talking calmly and using soft touches. This can have a great effect on the horse's heart rate as well as its attitude. As the vet starts the examination perform good horsemanship skills by staying on the same side of the horse as the vet and talking to the horse to keep it focused and still.

If your horse has been acting strangely or odd during the ride, then relate this to the vet before the examination so that potential problems may be more closely addressed. Remember, the vets are not there to pull you, but to help you get through the ride.

Trot-out: be prepared

Be prepared to trot your horse, as this is a vital part of the examination, to check for lameness as well as to perform a CRI (cardiac recovery index). If you are having a physical problem, felling sick or have difficulty trotting your horse then have someone with you to trot or assist with the trotting of your horse.

Do not wait until the vet asks you to trot and then comment that you need someone

> to trot your horse. It is not the vet's or his/her assistant's place to trot your horse; they are there to observe and scribe. (Also, this is not being courteous to your fellow riders to have them waiting because you were not prepared.)

Practice trotting at home and

be able to execute it smoothly. The way you trot your horse influences the way it travels and can make the horse appear asymmetrical in its movement or off. Not trotting at all results in failure and may suggest that the horse may be hurting too much to trot freely. Also a reliable CRI requires the horse to trot freely and promptly.

Start with a loose rein. Standing beside the horse's neck, tell the horse to trot via voice command or encouragement with the other end of the reins. Trot in a straight line away from the vet and do not look back at the horse. Stop at the end of the trot-out lane and turn into the horse while slowly turning him around and then trot straight back, staying at his side.

After the check

At this point, if you have been attentive getting the horse cooled down, pulsed down and trotted out smoothly, and all is OK, you have made it through the vet check. Now you can exit the area and allow the horse to eat, roll, rub its head, or whatever it wants to relax and rest. Make sure to take care of yourself, too.

If a problem was found at the check, most vets will give you a time frame to come back for a recheck. Proceed to exit the vet area and see if you can find a solution to the problem noted, such as a rock in the shoe, missing shoe, swollen or sore tendons, ill-fitting tack or rubs, no appetite, etc., before returning for the recheck.

If the horse requires a more in-depth examination by the vet to determine a reason for a problem, be considerate of other riders and re-present to the vets when they are not busy or have other riders waiting.

As I said at the beginning, the ride is not over until you get through all vet checks, including the post-ride check. Therefore doing your part properly can make this process as smooth and painless as possible.
